1.	<p>Compromise the human rights of a suspected terrorist to protect society at large.</p> <p>Explanation: Suspects can be subject to a Control Order, which severely restricts who a person can meet, where they can go and all cases so far have involved electronic tagging.</p>	o		
2.	<p>Allow the secret services (MI5 and MI6) to take part in secret spying activities to uncover terrorist plans (this would include tapping phones, using undercover agents to infiltrate suspected groups)</p>	o		
3.	<p>Use secret evidence to arrest suspects without telling them or their lawyers what the evidence is.</p>	o		
4.	<p>Pass a new law which deals specifically with terrorist suspects</p>	o		
5.	<p>Allow the police to detain a suspect indefinitely without trying them in court</p>		o	
6.	<p>Keep track of a suspect before they have been found guilty of committing terrorist activities by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✍ putting an electronic tag on them to track their movements <p>Explanation: See 1 above</p>	o

9.	<p>Give the Home Secretary the power to make the decision about whether a person should be subject to restrictions on their freedom</p> <p>Explanation: Judges decide who can be subject to a Control Order</p>		o
